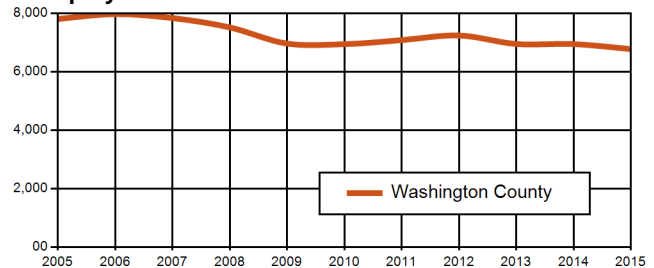

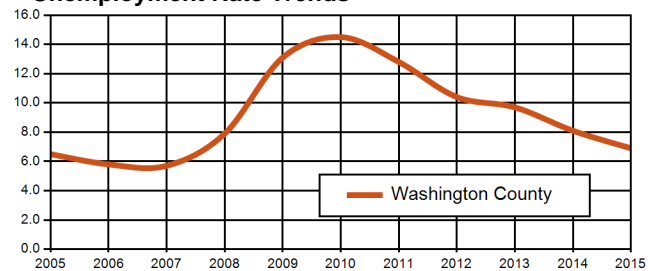

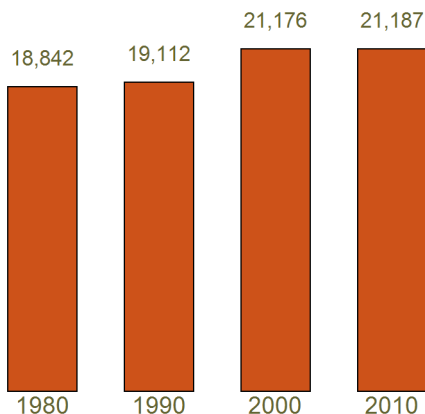
Unemployment Rate Trends

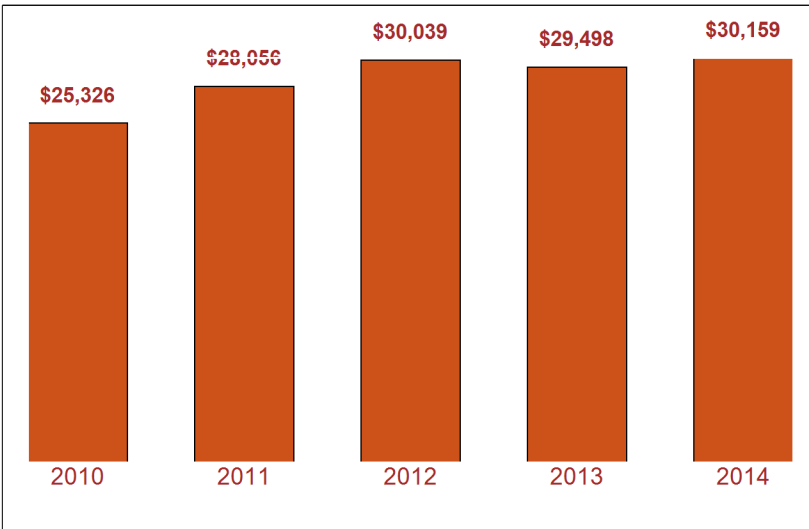

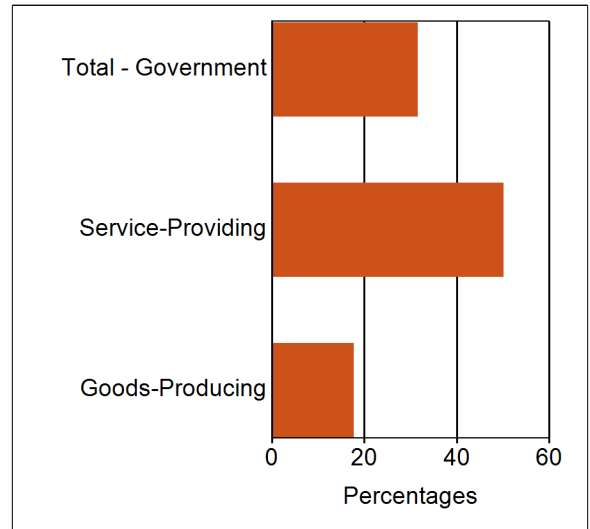
Washington Per Capita Income
